# Kathy Borgman Honored at Annual Meeting: Executive Director Retires after Decades of Service

→ The Friends of Arrow Rock marked the end of an era this year with the retirement of Kathy Borgman as executive director.

or 31 years, Kathy served as the organization's first and only executive director. Under her leadership, the Friends grew from a small, all-volunteer group to a nationally recognized historic preservation and history education organization. During her tenure, the Friends received the American Association for State and Local History's Albert B. Corey Award, Arrow Rock was designated as a Preserve America Community by First Lady Laura Bush, and the village was named as one of the Dozen Distinctive Destinations by the National Trust for Historic Preservation.

For her outstanding efforts on behalf of Arrow Rock, Kathy received the Exemplary Community Achievement Award from the Missouri Humanities Council, as well as Missouri Preservation's Rozier Award, the highest honor for historic preservation in Missouri.

More than 150 people turned out to honor Kathy at the Friends of Arrow Rock's 56th Annual Meeting on May 31 at the historic 1872 Christian Church. A video retrospective recounted Kathy's career in pictures, followed by a presentation from Senator David Pearce who read a Missouri Senate resolution recognizing her service. Friends President Tom Hall offered a moving tribute and gave her a framed board resolution signed by all the trustees. The ceremony culminated with the Friends of Arrow Rock bestowing upon Kathy its highest honor: the Distinguished Service Award.

In lieu of personal gifts, Kathy asked that donations be made to the building preservation fund. The outpouring was tremendous, with more than \$34,000 in gifts and pledges made in her honor. Supporters also wrote notes of appreciation, which were presented to her at the annual meeting.

"I want to thank everyone for the wonderful retirement send-off," Kathy said. "I was overwhelmed both with the number who were able to attend the annual meeting and with the many additional greetings that were sent via the personal tribute cards. I had no

### — PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE —

### 2015 Marked by Big Changes and Tremendous Accomplishments

Ven with major changes, the past year has been another successful one for the Friends. After 31 years as our executive director, Kathy Borgman retired at the end of January 2015, and was succeeded by Interim Executive Director Steve Byers. Steve is very capably filling Kathy's position on a short-term basis, for a period of no longer than one year.

Kathy was recognized at the Annual Meeting on May 31 with the Distinguished Service Award, the highest award given by the Friends. Kathy also was given a tribute signed by every member of the board of trustees, a resolution in her honor from the Missouri Senate, and a collection of 134 personal notes sent by members of the Friends and others from all over the country thanking her for her years of dedicated service. The organization received gifts in honor of Kathy for the Building Fund; the \$34,000 total was announced at the Annual Meeting. Kathy had asked that gifts recognizing her retirement should not be given to her, but instead should be designated for this important FAR fund.

A search committee has received applications from a wide variety of highly qualified candidates for the position of permanent executive director; the committee will make a recommendation this fall to the Friends' board of trustees. The successful candidate for this competitive position will begin work early in 2016.

The fundraising goal of \$460,000 to match an incentive grant of \$230,000 from the Jeffris Family Foundation was reached and exceeded at the end of December 2014, six months before the Jeffris deadline, for a total of \$715,000 in cash and pledges. These gifts from 22 generous donors will be used to complete definitive restorations and adaptations of four of the Friends' most historic buildings.

A grant from the Pillsbury Foundation of Frontenac, Missouri, is funding the production of the Friends' first film, a one-hour documentary on the life and art of Arrow Rock artist George Caleb Bingham. Produced by Wide Awake Films of Kansas City, Missouri, and tentatively titled *The American Artist: The Life & Times of George Caleb Bingham*, the documentary will be ready for distribution in the summer of 2016. All proceeds from its sale and broadcast will go to the Friends.

The Friends' education programs continue to thrive under the capable leadership of Education Director Mandy Dorrance. These include the popular spring program that brings school groups to Arrow Rock, and the Children's Craft Festival. A successful new event, the Arrow Rock Writing Workshop, took place Sept. 11 and 12; it was led by our events planner and communications director Sandy Selby. Sandy also maintains the Friends' website (friendsofarrowrock.org) and Facebook page.

These are just a few of the highlights from the wide variety of the Friends' activities during the past year, all designed to fulfill our dual mission of historic preservation and history education. I hope that you will visit Arrow Rock sometime soon to see for yourself all that your membership is making possible. Thanks for being a Friend!

### — EDUCATION REPORT — History Comes Alive In Arrow Rock

gorgeous sunny day greeted the 1,100 students and 250 adults who came to Arrow Rock for the Children's Craft Festival on Sept. 24. After severe weather washed out last year's festival, the beautiful weather was especially welcome. The children were entertained and educated by more than 70 volunteers who demonstrated the activities and games that were part of daily life for the children of the 1800s. FAR Education Director Mandy Dorrance reports that the event raised more than \$5,000 for Friends of Arrow Rock education programs. In addition, FAR sold more than \$1,000 in toys from our museum shop! Both attendance and income from this event increased from 2012, when the event last took place.

Friends of Arrow Rock's Spring Education Programs are still going strong more than three decades after their inception. Each spring, school groups from throughout the region come to Arrow Rock for a hands-on history lesson. In addition to the always popular "Family Life and School Days in the 1800s" program, FAR added three new offerings in 2015: "Natural and Cultural History" led by the Missouri River Bird Observatory; "Arrow Rock and the Santa Fe Trail"; and

"Tales from the Santa Fe Trail," an activity at the Arrow Rock State Historic Site. Despite the loss of one large school that had participated in the past, the spring programs still drew 915 participants and brought in \$2,606 for FAR.

## FAR Tackles Major Preservation & Maintenance Projects in 2015

he preservation of Arrow Rock's most significant historic buildings and artifacts is an important part of the Friends of Arrow Rock mission. Properties Manager Marty Selby keeps a close eye on all 13 FAR properties to make sure the buildings are safe and sound for today's visitors, and will stand strong for generations to come. In addition to the routine maintenance that is essential to good preservation, the Friends have accomplished these major property projects this year:



- The complete replacement of the floor (with installation of a vapor barrier and subfloor) thanks to a generous donation from Zemula Pierce Fleming, plus electrical rewiring of the Christian Church.
- The restoration of the Packard chapel pump organ at the Christian Church, thanks to generous support from the Arrow Rock Federated Church..
- The installation of gutter drains to divert water from the foundation of the Christian Church.
- The professional mitigation of bird guano and mold from the attic of the Odd Fellows Lodge.
- · The removal of asbestos from the Miller-Bradford House.
- The installation of storm windows to protect the original windows at the Brown Lodge No. 22 (Black History Museum), thanks to a generous donation from Pam Parsons.
- The preparation and design phases for stabilization and restoration work on four Friends properties The Odd Fellows Lodge, the Masonic Lodge, the John P. Sites Gunsmith Shop and the Sites House funded in part by the Jeffris Family Foundation.

# FAR Meets Local Match Goal for Jeffris Challenge Grant

The Jeffris Family Foundation has notified the Friends of Arrow Rock that it has met the requirements of a \$230,000 challenge grant for historic preservation.

FAR will use the funds for major restorations on four historic buildings in the heart of Arrow Rock: the John P. Sites House, the John P. Sites Gunsmith Shop, the Masonic Lodge and the Independent Order of Odd Fellows Lodge. The Odd Fellows Lodge is the home of the Missouri Press Foundation's Print Shop Museum, as well as an IOOF assembly room authentically furnished to the period of the late 1800s.

Thanks to the generous support of its donors, the Friends

of Arrow Rock surpassed the local matching goal of \$460,000 in order to qualify for the challenge grant. Major contributors to the local match were the Taylor & Patti Abernathy Trust, Bank of America, Trustee; Huston Bell; the Bray Family Foundation; the Buckner Foundation; Charles and Kathy Digges; the Martin L. Foltz Foundation, Wood & Huston Bank, Trustee; the Allen P. and Josephine B. Green Foundation; John Irvin; the William T. Kemper Foundation, Commerce Bank, Trustee; the Miller-Mellor Association; the Missouri Press Foundation; the Grand Lodge of Missouri, Independent Order of Odd Fellows; the Ed Steele Fund: and the Sunderland Foundation.

"This challenge grant will fund much needed work on four very historically significant properties of the Friends of Arrow Rock," said Friends president Tom Hall. "We are very grateful for the gifts we have received for this effort and especially to the Jeffris Family Foundation, which has been a catalyst for the whole effort."

Hall noted that the success of this challenge grant drive has laid a solid foundation for launching Phase 2 of the fundraising effort, which will include furnishing and equipping the conference room in the Masonic Lodge.

The Jeffris Family Foundation was founded in 1979 by Bruce Jeffris, former chairman of the board of the Parker Pen Co., his wife, Eleanor, and their son Tom, who now serves as its president. Based in Janesville, Wisconsin, the Jeffris Family Foundation focuses its funding on preserving buildings of national and regional significance in small towns and cities in eight Midwestern states.

Meeting the challenge goal garnered significant media coverage, including television, newspaper and radio features, and got picked up by the Associated Press, which generated several additional repeat stories, some of which are way outside our traditional market. It even got a mention in USA Today.

### EVENTS REPORT 2015 Sip & Stroll Sets Fundraising Record

The Friends of Arrow Rock's annual Sip & Stroll fundraiser, held on Sept. 19, netted \$17,407 — the most ever for the event! The event featured a tour of local homes, dinner at the Old Schoolhouse, and silent and live auctions.

### FAR Salutes Volunteer Emily Bird



t was a good day for the Friends of Arrow Rock when Emily Bird asked if there was something she could volunteer to do for FAR. Indeed there was, and her first day of volunteering was January 10, 2009. We had just begun work with **Conservation Consultant** Cindee Herrick, and one of our first tasks was to place temperature and humidity monitors in each of our properties and to record readings twice a month.

Emily recalls, "In March, I met Cindee. I had such a nice time with her. Wow, did I learn a lot about all the treasures in Arrow Rock and how important it is to take care of them. I progressed to entering data into the computer about all the collections. It turned out to be quite a task with lots of detail, and accuracy a must. I volunteered 163 hours in 2009."

In 2010, Emily switched from reading the monitors

to another data entry job. Since Emily had retired from a data entry job, her skills were just what we needed to computerize all our membership information. That was her major task through 2011. Emily and her husband, Jim, along with Mandy Dorrance (a volunteer at that time and now Friends of Arrow Rock's education director) took on the added task in 2012 of inventorying the gun shop collection under the guidance of Cindee Herrick.

Recently Emily and her husband relocated to Columbia, and she has ended her volunteer service with us after six years. Her volunteer hours during that time totaled 665 hours!

"I can't express our appreciation enough," said former Executive Director Kathy Borgman. "What important jobs she performed for us, always with great competence and a smile. It's truly an example of the important role a dedicated volunteer plays in an organization like the Friends. Thank you, Emily!"

# WE REMEMBER A FRIEND: BYRON SHUTZ

Byron Shutz loved history: the history of his home state of Missouri, the history of the Civil War and its predecessor, the Missouri-Kansas

"Border War," the history of Kansas City, and his own family's history, which was closely intertwined with all of these. His love for Arrow Rock and its history came later, about 1990, when Byron generously donated the Christopher Collection of Early Missouri Firearms, and funds for its restoration and display, to the Friends of Arrow Rock.

The Christopher Collection meant a great deal to Byron, because it had been assembled by his grandfather, Max Christopher, and given to Byron when he was a boy. Byron wanted to find an appropriate home for the collection, and although neither he nor his family had any previous connection with Arrow Rock, he felt that the Friends would be good caretakers of this unique collection, which had meant so much to him. Since that time, Byron and his wife Marilyn have remained generous and consistent supporters of the Friends' mission of historic preservation and history

> education. The Friends are one of many history-related organizations that have received regular, ongoing support from the Byron Christopher Shutz Historic Preservation Fund at the Kansas City Community Foundation. Just last year, a generous gift from Byron and Marilyn made possible the publication of our new history book, *Friends of Arrow Rock: The First* 55 *Years*.

In many other ways, Byron showed his friendship for Arrow Rock and its history. Although he supported a wide variety of causes and organizations in the Kansas City area, Byron felt a special tie to our small town and to the Friends. We were greatly honored when the FAR was designated by Byron's family to receive gifts in his memory following his death on April 11.

Byron will be remembered in

Arrow Rock as a dedicated historian, a loyal supporter, and a good friend. We will miss him.


