We thank Missouri State Parks, the Department of Natural Resources, and the Arrow Rock State Historic Site for their ongoing commitment to the Huston Tavern. Janet and Alan are collaborating on our menu, returning to traditional fare with enticing new additions and an expanded wine selection.

With much gratitude to the Sunderland and Buckner Foundations, our renovations of the Christian Church, Brown's Chapel and the Miller-Bradford House continue. The Christian Church now has heating and air conditioning. This will allow for comfortable, year-round use and rental of this lovely structure. Stateof-the-art technology capabilities will soon be installed at Brown's Chapel along with structural work and a new kitchen. The Miller-Bradford House is undergoing extensive foundation and patio work in addition to exterior painting.

You will appreciate the tribute in this issue to Dr. and Mrs. John Lawrence for their many contributions to Arrow Rock and the FAR. We are deeply grateful to their children, Mary Harrell, John Jr., and their family, and thank them for the opportunity to purchase a nine-and-a-half acre tract of land on the northeast bluff adjoining the village and U.S. Department of the Interior land.

There are some interesting events coming up. We are honored to host nationally recognized preservationist and PBS host Bob Yapp for a series of workshops on May 1, during Preservation Month. The annual Spring Garden Market & Vintage Bazaar, and the Birds and Bees Festival on May 8, will be an enjoyable opportunity to share all things Mother Nature.

# **Stronger Than Ever**

FRIENDS OF ARROW ROCK MEETS THE CHALLENGES OF A DIFFICULT YEAR

**ARROW ROCK** has weathered hard times before. Since its founding in 1829, it has survived fires and storms, political upheaval, economic downturns, and yes, even disease outbreaks. There was never a doubt that Arrow Rock would make it through a turbulent 2020.

Fiends of Arrow Rock did better than just survive. We found opportunities to advance our missions of historic preservation and history education, and as we welcome the hopeful season of spring, we are poised to build on what we learned through last year's adversity.

Like other Missouri businesses, we shut down our offices and retail operation during most of the month of April 2020, and that meant our spring education programs were shut down, too. Since we couldn't welcome schoolchildren to Arrow Rock, we sent Arrow Rock to them. Executive Director Sandy Selby and **Operations Director Mandy Dorrance** produced an educational series of videos, worksheets and projects that youngsters could enjoy at home. For the grown-up learners, we offered online versions of our popular First Saturday lectures.

When we reopened our office, gift shop and two museums – the Dr. John Sappington Memorial Museum and the Arrow Rock Black History Museum – our board of trustees had put COVID safety precautions in place to protect our visitors and staff. We installed Plexiglas shields and hand sanitizer stations, and provided masks.

There was no way to safely conduct our tours in 2020, but the tour app we developed in 2017 (available for free download on any smartphone) made it possible for visitors to learn the history of the town and its structures through prerecorded audio presentations. Instead of leading tours, Historical Interpreters Elaine Breshears, Sue Day and Monte Holder shared the town's stories with visitors who came through our shop. Our knowledgeable interpretation staff is looking forward to being back in the tour tram starting on Memorial Day weekend this year.

To help put our best face forward to visitors, we spruced up our gift shop with a fresh coat of interior paint and some delightful new merchandise, including the highly

regarded Beekman 1802 skincare line, a fun assortment of handcrafted candy, and a new selection of educational children's books. Typically, our shop contributes a small percentage to our revenue, but our sales were strong in 2020 and given the cancellation of so many programs, it really gave us a boost. Shoppers appreciate that their purchases help support our historic preservation and history education work.

Friends of Arrow Rock was founded in 1959 with a focus on historic preservation; even a global pandemic couldn't shake us from that mission. Thanks to a generous grant from the Sunderland Foundation, we were able to do critical work on the Miller-Bradford House. That work included electrical and plumbing updates, structural repairs, and an amazing restoration of the space that once served as a kitchen where enslaved individuals worked. Since 2019, the Miller-Bradford House has been the location for the Missouri Folk Art Shop & Gallery. Shoppers are enthralled with both the merchandise and the beautiful surroundings of this important historic building.

The 1872 Christian Church, a charming little church located on Arrow Rock's Main Street, got a modern update that will make it more attractive as a venue for weddings, concerts and other events: heating and air conditioning. Our historic preservation consultant, Marty Selby, worked closely with our contractors to design a system that would provide comfort while being as unobtrusive as possible. Mission accomplished!

Next up on our project list is an update of the kitchen, restrooms and fellowship area at Brown's Chapel. This project, also funded through the Sunderland Foundation, will help us honor this historically Black church by preserving the character of the building while making it more comfortable as a meeting space.

Friends of Arrow Rock members love a good party and we missed being able spend time together in person. Our board of trustees and committees became adept at online meetings, but our annual fundraisers were a bigger challenge. After researching all the options, we selected a company called OneCause to help us manage online versions of our fall and winter fundraisers. The virtual auctions for those two events were a marvelous success and because they took place online, even our faraway friends were able to take part. We sent auction items to winning bidders as far away as California, Michigan, Delaware, Florida and Texas!

We anticipate a return to in-person events this year, perhaps incorporating virtual components so our out-of-state friends can still join in on the fun. Our events committee is busy making plans! See our calendar on Page 5.

Friends of Arrow Rock knows there will still be challenges and opportunities to adapt to new ways of working and serving the public in 2021. Just like the Arrow Rockers who came before us, we'll be ready for whatever comes our way. **AR**

# **Tradition On The Menu**

#### THE J. HUSTON TAVERN PROMISES OLD-FASHIONED FARE FROM ITS NEW KITCHEN

#### IF YOU

visit Arrow Rock this summer, we hope you'll come

hungry. Construction is nearing completion on the new kitchen at the J. Huston Tavern and our Tavern team is getting ready to serve you. Friends of Arrow Rock partnered with Missouri State Parks in 2019, with FAR assuming management of the restaurant business and the state committing to care for the building's maintenance. That partnership was put to an early test in May 2019, when an electrical fire destroyed the restaurant's kitchen. Missouri State Parks stepped in right away to supply a temporary kitchen trailer that our kitchen manager, Janet Carmack, and her crew worked out of through the end of 2019 and into early 2020.

Then came COVID, and the resulting shutdown coincided with the time Missouri State Parks needed to rebuild the kitchen. The new, expanded space will give our kitchen staff more room to work, plenty of storage space, and much-needed improvements, like an efficient air conditioning system in the kitchen.

That construction project gave Friends of Arrow Rock and the Village of Arrow Rock an opportunity to tackle another longstanding need: convenient public restroom facilities. Friends of Arrow Rock led the fundraising effort and continues to raise money for the \$132,000 restroom project. The restrooms will be ready by July to provide comfort to Arrow Rock visitors. In the meantime, new General Manager Alan Hagedorn has been working with Chef Janet to hone the menu with a focus on the kind of old-fashioned fare that has been popular with Tavern customers since it opened in 1834 – fried chicken, country ham, beef brisket, and pork tenderloin. Yum! **AR** 



Once construction wraps up, the J. Huston Tavern will be open Wednesday-Saturday from 11 a.m. until 8 p.m., Sundays from 11 a.m. until 2 p.m., and before and after every Lyceum show. The Tavern is currently accepting reservations for dates after July 23. Call Alan at 660-837-3200 or visit the Tavern online at HustonTavern.com.


## **Descendant Pens New Book About Meredith Miles Marmaduke**

# John & Mariana Lawrence

Friends of Arrow Rock was established in 1959 by people who were passionate about preserving the architectural treasures and rich history of our village. Although we know their names, many of today's Friends never had the chance to meet the men and women who left us such a marvelous legacy. In this and future issues of our newsletter, we'll introduce you to some of the visionaries who set a preservation movement into motion.



Dozens of men and women, all donning formal attire, arrived at the restored Prairie Park mansion on October 6, 1984, to celebrate one of the most monumental events in Friends of Arrow Rock history: the successful launch of an endowment fund. It was a grand occasion, presided over by the home's owners, Dr. John and Mariana Lawrence.

For the Lawrences, who had been present at the organization's birth and who had invested time, money and no small amount of sweat equity into FAR's success, it was an assurance that the organization would live on, even after its founders were gone. John Lawrence was a Missourian through and through. He was born in 1905 in Milan, Missouri, attended college at Culver-Stockton College, and medical school at St. Louis University, and practiced medicine in Marshall for 41 years.

Mariana was born in 1910 in Amarillo, Texas, and moved with her family to Marshall when she was a youngster. She attended Missouri Valley College and, for a time after graduation, traveled throughout the region with a business that helped communities put on their own amateur theatrical productions.

"He considered himself a northerner," says their daughter Harrel Lawrence, "And my mother considered herself a southerner. He was always a staunch Republican and she was a staunch Democrat, so they always canceled each other's votes out and they always argued about politics."


They found common ground, though, in their enthusiasm for fixing up a rundown plantation house called Prairie Park, located just a few miles west of Arrow Rock. It was an early sign of the couple's power of foresight when they walked through that house for the first time. There was no plumbing, no electricity. The wide, winding staircase was far from grand when piled with chicken incubating boxes. Dripping liquid from hams hung from the ceiling had permanently discolored the wood floors in one room. The glass in the third-floor belvedere windows had been painted over to block the light. Every part of the house needed attention, and lots of it.

Their son John Jr. recalls that they set out on their renovation adventure with a four-year plan. "It took two four-year plans to get us moved in," he says.

The Lawrences discovered like-minded preservationists in Arrow Rock locals Red and Lucia Argubright, Mary Louise Pearson, and others who made the trip to Prairie Park for meetings to discuss starting an organization dedicated to preservation in Arrow Rock.

There was a lot for the couple to juggle at the time, with two growing children (Harrel likely holds the distinction of being the only person to roller skate through the rooms of Prairie Park), and John's demanding career. He was on call for 41 years, recalls John Jr. "Mom and Dad used to go to Mexico for a month every February. It was common knowledge that some couples would plan their pregnancies so he would be there when they had their babies. He was really beloved by the community."

Mariana busied herself with volunteer work and was somewhat legendary in the area for her baking skills and floral arrangements. Horses were a particular passion of hers. "She loved horses," Harrel says, "and that was really her fun. She would ride every day until at 75, she fell off her horse and my dad wouldn't let her ride anymore. She would still go down and brush them and talk to them. Around the house, she almost always had jodhpurs on and a little low pair of riding boots. That was her



outfit, like we might wear blue jeans." Even their closest friends may not have known that both John and Mariana had musical talent. John played the violin, although as far as his children know, *Ave Maria* was the only song in his repertoire. Mariana played the ukulele. "But she was shy about it," Harrel says. "No one outside the family ever heard her play."

The Lawrences, along with their friends the Argubrights, purchased two endangered buildings in Arrow Rock in the hope they could be saved. The first, the old courthouse building, became the first Friends of Arrow Rock preservation project. The second, a vacated Baptist Church building, was transformed into the Arrow Rock Lyceum Theatre.

"I remember before the first opening night, my mom was in the kitchen and she had the curtain for the Lyceum on the floor," Harrel says. "She was sewing it up with it all laid out on the floor. And that's how they had an opening night curtain."

The Lawrence's preservation work continued, both on their own home, and in Arrow Rock until health issues forced them to move away. Their legacy lingers on through the buildings they saved and the organizations they helped nurture here in Arrow Rock. **AR**
